CBC in partnership with Every Home for Christ (EHFC) began supporting Pastor William in 2014.

This began with our first project with EHFC of installing wells in Malawi. Over 3 years, CBC via May Mission Months was able in total to provide the funds for 84 wells.

As we supported the wells providing water for their physical needs, in tandem we commenced support of William to provide water for their spiritual needs. Through the years, we have been overwhelmed in the way that God, through the power of His Spirit has worked through the ministry of William amongst his people.

Pastor William works primarily in Northern Malawi evangelising, spreading the good news of Jesus and discipling new Christians.

- Distribute literature house to house
- Visit Prisons





ASIA'S HOPE THE LIGHT HOUSE \$39,000

The Light House home in Battambang Cambodia is one of 14 homes in the Asia's Hope community complex. There are 20 children in the Light House family who are parented by Saret and Chrep as house parents. We did have 23 in the home but 3 of the kids are now young adults and have left the home and are at University.

Saret and Chrep live at the home and raised their own biological children alongside the Asia's Hope kids. Our Light House kids are not treated as patients or boarders, rather they have become brothers and sisters, sons and daughters.

The Light House functions as a family; the kids do chores, cook together, eat together, do homework and go to church together. In the context of this loving home, our financial assistance towards the home ensures the children receive the support and care they need to reclaim their lost childhood and build the foundations for a successful future in Christ.

Over the last seven years, we have personally witnessed the formation of each child. With three family members now at university and with two more in their last year of high school the work is far from complete. What we can say is that these kids who were once on the streets orphaned, abandoned and begging, are now in the arms of Jesus and thriving.





FAR EAST BROADCASTING \$5,000

Broadcasting the Gospel into peoples homes

FEBC (Far East Broadcasting) Australia is part of a global media ministry spreading the Gospel to inspire people to follow Jesus Christ: broadcasting in 50+ countries, in 130 languages, for 2500+ hours daily.

FEBC is on air, online and on the ground. They communicate the Good News among the nations by media to inspire people to follow Jesus Christ.

- On air Starting with radio, and still primarily using this versatile and ubiquitous medium, FEBC uses traditional shortwave, AM and FM radio to deliver the Good News on air.
- Online FEBC broadcasts internationally on many platforms, such as internet, mobile app, satellite.
- On the ground Another vital link in the success of FEBC's media mission is radio with hands and feet: FEBC teams working on the ground with churches, people in the community, other missions and NGOs.

Wherever they are, FEBC serve people at their point of need. People may be oppressed or persecuted, living in poverty, devastated by disaster, geographically isolated, homeless or in exile. Despite these obstacles, media can connect people.

In order to deliver this most effectively, FEBC work with partners and communities to address their own local issues using media. They find it's key to work with partners rooted in the communities they serve and speaking the languages of their people, enabling them to be active agents of change in their own areas.
