## CROSSING THE STREET: FRUITFUL MISSION

Share any experiences that members of the group have had in crossing the street.

## Read John 15:1-8

- 1. Jesus is using an analogy here that was a familiar symbol to his Jewish hearers. God had repeatedly used the vine as a symbol of His people in the Hebrew Scriptures (one example is Psalm 80:8-9). Yet it was often used in a negative sense (as in Isaiah 5:1-2,7 and Jeremiah 2:21). Jesus publicly taught about Israel being like a vineyard in the Parable of the Vineyard (Matthew 21:33-44).
- 2. In planting and growing a vineyard (a church), what parts do God, Jesus and we play?
- 3. 'Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.' What does it mean to remain/abide in Jesus? How do we remain/abide in Him each day?
- 4. Have another look over John 15:1-8 and note all the times "fruit" is mentioned. What "fruit" is this talking about? How can we produce "fruit that will last" (John 15:16)?
- 5. List some ways you as a Group can be more intentional about producing "fruit that will last".
- 6. Fruit may take many years to mature, yet we can become quite impatient in wanting the fruit to be produced more quickly. How might we as a group or church invest in producing mature fruit over time?
- 7. How might we invest in future generations, some who are yet to be born?
- 8. God plants. What does it mean to be connected not only to the vine but also with other branches?
- 9. God prunes. What is the purpose of pruning? What might this look like for us at CBC?
- 10. God provides. What resources has God provided for us here at CBC? How can we be good stewards of God's resources?

PRAY: That God will open up opportunities for us, individually, to be more fruitful as His disciples. That the church will have a greater emphasis on reaching people with the gospel.
