

Bible Study Questions 8TH September 2024

Introduction

In this passage of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus makes some BIG claims that are both exhilarating and exhausting! What exhilarates you about your Christian faith and what exhausts you (be honest)?

Read & Reflect

Read Matthew 5:17-20 at least twice using different versions of the Bibles. As you read or listen to the words, reflect and share on the following:

- What stands out or what do you notice?
- What questions are raised for you?
- What challenges you?

Questions

- In verses 17 and 18 Jesus answers the Pharisees by claiming he **fulfils** the Law & Prophets (i.e. the whole Hebrew scriptures). How does Jesus fulfil the following passages from the Old Testament?
 - Deuteronomy 30:6
 - Isaiah 63:1-3
 - Ezekiel 36:25-27
 - Zechariah 12:10-13:1
 - Jeremiah 31:31-33
- Jesus holds the Law (the first five books of the bible including the 10 commandments) in very high regard, yet also says he fulfils it. Use the below passages to discuss how Jesus fulfilled the Law:
 - -Romans 8:3
 - -Galatians 3:1-4
 - -Romans 13:8-10
- Even though Jesus has said he fulfils the Law, he then seems to make everything harder again by saying: "20 For I tell you that unless your righteousness surpasses that of the Pharisees and the teachers of the law, you will certainly not enter the kingdom of heaven."

Later, in verse 48 he says a similar thing: "Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect."

This feels like an impossibly high bar! Does Jesus want us to perfectly live out the Sermon on the Mount?
