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Background & governance

The **Oversight Team of Caringbah Baptist Church (CBC)** has established this policy to express our commitment to safeguarding vulnerable people involved with CBC.

This document outlines the underlying principles that guide our approach and the strategies being implemented to embed a safeguarding culture in the organisation at all levels.¹ Because of the changing nature of our world and our organisation, we commit to regularly reviewing and updating this policy to ensure its ongoing effectiveness, relevance and fulfilment of any State and Federal laws to protect children and vulnerable people.^{2, 3}

1. Commitment to safeguard vulnerable people

CBC is committed to the biblical call to actively prevent harm and abuse and ensure the safety and equity of everyone involved in our organisation with special concern for vulnerable people who face a higher risk of mistreatment.⁴ This includes children and young people, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders, the elderly, people with disabilities, and people with identity and mental health challenges.⁵

It is important that all people involved in our organisation (including vulnerable people and children) are informed about their rights, invited to express their individual needs, participate in decisions which significantly affect them, and have their concerns taken seriously.⁶ We also want families and communities who are involved in our organisation to be informed and involved in promoting the safety and wellbeing of vulnerable people.⁷ All people are encouraged to appropriately express their cultural backgrounds and racism will not be tolerated within the organisation.⁸

To help achieve this, we have developed a procedure ([Procedure for recruitment of staff and volunteers july2026.docx](#)) for staff and volunteers that indicates the processes for appointment, training and induction required at each level of involvement in ministry or volunteering at CBC.

This material will help people in our community to better understand their shared responsibility to safeguard vulnerable people around our community and how to raise any concerns. We actively encourage everyone involved in our organisation to be involved in the effectiveness and ongoing improvement of our policies and safeguarding procedures, whether related to physical, emotional or spiritual safety.⁹

2. Commitment to respond to concerns

We are committed to creating a culture where people feel safe and encouraged to raise concerns about their own or other people's safety.

Therefore, we encourage people at all levels of the organisation and in our community to report any concerns they have about the safety and wellbeing of people connected with **CBC**. We are committed to listening well and handling all concerns seriously. We will protect the confidentiality, dignity, health and well-being of all individuals involved in any concern raised. Any child-related issues will be managed with a focus on the interest of the child.¹⁰

All reports will be managed by the **CBC Safe Church Team Contacts**.¹¹

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The Safe Church Team Contacts are a sub-committee of the **CBC Oversight Team**. When any concerns or allegations are raised, the Safe Church Team Contacts will follow the relevant procedure depending on the type of concern that is raised, e.g., whether child protection or complaint against staff or volunteers. After considering the circumstances of the concern, a response may involve reporting the concern or allegation to other entities like the Police, the relevant State Child Protection body, and the insurer of **CBC**. In certain incidents the Safe Church Team Contacts will appoint an Independent Ministry Investigator to investigate allegations.

3. Commitment to screening and training

We are committed to ensuring all leaders at **Caringbah Baptist Church** are appropriately screened, supported and trained.¹²

This means all leadership members, staff members, team leaders and volunteers involved in personal/relational serving roles (including anyone working with or around children) must follow the direction of the Safe Church Team Contacts who oversee this compliance. These leaders must:

1. Be regular participants at CBC;
2. Provide referees who can confirm they are suitable to work with vulnerable people;
3. Complete an approved safe ministry training course which outlines appropriate behaviour, including how to minimise the chance of harm, as well as training in how to identify and report cases of abuse (this can be completed at <https://creatingsafespaces.org.au/>);
4. Commit to the CBC Code of Conduct for Staff and Volunteers, including being willing to be held accountable for their behaviour; and
5. If they are working with children & youth, they must have their NSW “Working With Children Check” verified and current.
6. Continue to develop the knowledge and skills to create safe spaces for everyone, particularly children and young people. This includes up to date adherence to Caringbah Baptist Church policies and procedures applicable to legal obligations in regards to child protection reporting¹³, what constitutes reportable conduct¹⁴ and the Grievance Resolution Policy¹⁵.

No-one with a criminal record of child abuse, molestation or similar offences is allowed to be involved in children or youth ministry at CBC.

4. Commitment to safe and accessible programs

We are committed to ensuring that our physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing for all involved.¹⁶ Careful consideration will be given to the activities chosen, the venue, safe ratios of supervision, appropriate toileting practices, transportation, work health and safety, parental or guardian permission and confidentiality of records kept.

The Safe Church Team Contacts will regularly check-in on CBC programs and team meetings to help establish a safeguarding culture and provide ongoing training and supervision to leaders and volunteers in those roles.¹⁷

5. Risk management

CBC will ensure that Ministry Leaders complete and make a record of a risk assessment in relation to any program or activity undertaken at, for or with CBC.

- ☐ for regular activities, the risk assessment will be conducted at least annually and whenever there are significant changes in the program activities, attendance or location.
- ☐ for special activities, the Ministry Leader or Safe Church Team will complete a risk assessment.

CBC will ensure that appropriate and reasonable precautions are adopted to address risks identified as part of a risk assessment. When considering what measures are appropriate, CBC will consider the likelihood of an incident occurring, the seriousness of the consequences and the difficulty of avoiding the risk.

CBC will store risk assessment forms in a secure location for a period of at least 45 years.

6. Third Parties

- a) CBC will require any third party (tenant or external party using church property) that provides services to children and/or young people to provide written confirmation of their compliance with the Child Safe Standards at least annually.
- b) The church will ensure that any affiliated entities (any entity or program that is, or is represented as, a ministry of the Church) comply with Child Safe Standards including annual reports to the governance body regarding child safety.

Glossary of Policy Terminology

Governance Body A Governance Body is a group of people that has the authority to exercise governance over an organisation or entity. Examples of a governance body in your organisation may include the pastors, elders, committee or board members.

Organisation An organised group of people with a particular purpose. Your faith-based organisation may be a church, mission organisation or ministry group.

Safeguarding Safeguarding is protecting the welfare and human rights of people that are, in some way, connected with your Organisation or its work – particularly people that may be at risk of abuse, neglect or exploitation. As such, safeguarding is part of your organisation's primary duty of care.

Safe Ministry Policy Statements that set expectations for decisions made, or actions taken by, members of an organisation related to the protection of rights of vulnerable people and the duties of, as well as the terms and conditions of engagement for, organisation members & volunteers.

Safe Church Team Contact A Safe Church Team Contact is someone in your organisation who will hear your concern and help you work out what to do.

Incident Management Process A document that outlines the process of and assists Safe Ministry Contacts in responding appropriately to concerns raised.

Vulnerable People While the term 'vulnerable people' includes everyone under the age of 18, the elderly, people with disabilities, people who experience mental health issues, people who are unable to live at home, people who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, or transgender, people who are intersex, as well as people of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent.
